1. What was your first part-time job?

I grew up on a farm and the way I earned money was to go rabbiting on weekends and school holidays. I went armed with a shovel, pocket knife and two old dogs. Dad sold the dried skins for me as I would have been 'ripped off' by the skin merchant. I received ninepence (8 cents) per skin.

2. How long have you worked in histology?

I commenced 51 years ago in Pathology, rotating through all labs as a trainee at QVH. My first payday was 'C' day*— earning the princely sum of \$17.48, less tax of 80 cents as it was only 4 days pay. I worked in Histology after finishing my Diploma doing locums with Dr Dorevitch in Camberwell, A/H at Cabrini, as well as weekend work in Biochemistry at RCH. I moved to Canberra in 1983 and have been in Histology ever since with 5 years in Sydney.

3. When people ask, "So, what do you do?" How do you explain Histology?

I explain that when doctors remove a skin lesion for example, we make the special preparations so that a diagnosis can be made. Unfortunately, I'm usually asked at meal times and have a reputation for killing appetites as I usually talk too enthusiastically.

4. What is a skill you'd like to learn and why?

Learn to play the violin. I've always loved the violin but never had the chance to learn. I'm assured I'm never too old to learn and a dear friend (brave woman) has offered to try and teach me!!!

5. If money was no object, what would you do all day?

Probably still work as I enjoy my work, especially in a research school. There are always different and interesting specimens to deal with and strange requests plus there are no difficult/demanding surgeons or pathologists.

6. What's an ideal weekend for you?

Cold and wet, with no need to feel guilty about not doing outside jobs – just turn up the heater and rug up with a couple of books.

7. If you could take only THREE items with you to a deserted island, what would they be?

As long as it could be three CARTONS of books, I'd be happy.

8. What is the best conference you have ever attended?

A tossup between Adelaide in 2009 and Melbourne in 2013.

9. What's on your bucket list this year?

Surviving the year – it seems out of control at present.

10. Where do you most want to travel, but have never been?

I love train travel so would love to travel the Trans-Siberian railway from Vladivostok to Moscow and then go on to Istanbul, travelling to Paris on the Orient Express.






