

Dry the slides completely at room temperature by draining them vertically before heating them in an oven or on a hotplate.



TISSUE MOUNTING TIP

Minimize wrinkles in the tissue section as they interfere with the direct contact between your section and glass slide.



ROTATE STOCK

Stock rotation is the first line of defense against temperature and humidity changes resulting in moisture contamination. The microscope slides should also be kept off of concrete floors on a pallet. Slides should be kept as far away as possible from doors and heating and air conditioning ducts to minimize temperature and humidity changes.



STAINS & REAGENT TIP

Monitor expiration dates carefully. Rotate/replace solutions based on sample volumes processed.



INSTRUMENT INSTRUCTIONS

To optimize the tissue processing results follow the instrument manufacturer safety and instructions for use carefully.



COVERSLIPPING TIP

Confirm compatibility between solvent and coverslipping medium.
